


"God's Not Dead" – This is a song title from the Newsboys, a Christian music group, and also the title of two recent movies. This title describes what is going on at ASM and our newest female programmer at Along Side Ministries, Misty George.

Misty's journey began in a very loving family in Louisiana. She was raised by a single mom who instilled in her a good perspective on morals and how to live life, albeit that perspective didn't include God. She moved to Tucson, Arizona when she was five and had a good child-hood there.

At 15, Misty began a slow descent into the dark world of drugs and sexuality. She began to use pot which led to alcohol abuse which took her to pills and then on to heroin and meth over a 15 year period. All that substance abuse finally crashed her life, and she was arrested at the age of thirty.



Drugs were the reason for her arrest, but it was Misty's viewpoint on men that had a significant impact on her outlook on life. Misty admits she saw men as targets and objects to get what she wanted. At 18, she sold herself the first time to obtain money for her drug of choice. Men found Misty very attractive, and were willing partners in this dark world of using one another.

Misty soon developed an appetite for "sugar daddies" in her life. Her first sugar daddy came when she was 19 and was arrested for a DUI. Her defense attorney promised to get her charges removed, if he could be her sugar daddy. She didn't care that he was married, only that he would provide the resources for her drug use. This began years of letting men use her so she could get the means for her drug lifestyle.

Misty found her way into the club scene and became a dancer as she continued to chase a lifestyle of drugs and depravity. She eventually worked the hotels, seeing men one after the other, plunging into a deeper and darker hole without God. Her eventual crime was going after a regular customer for payment that he had refused to give her. She borrowed a gun from a friend to scare this man into paying what she was owed. She and this friend went to this customer's home and at gun point robbed him of \$500.00. However, Misty's friend left his phone behind, which led to their seizure and arrest. She was sentenced to six years.

It was in jail and in isolation with no privileges that she began the journey to discovering that God is alive and loves her. With only a towel and a Bible in her cell, she began to read the powerful words in 1 John 4:19, "We love Him, because He first loved us". She read about the cross and what Jesus said about forgiving them for they know not what they do. She thought, "Who says this kind of thing? Who loves like this?" Misty's heart was beginning to soften toward God in those solitary moments in her cell.

She still had one last resistance to God's tugging at her heart. She wanted proof that He was real and not just words in a book. She screamed, "Prove Yourself by getting me get out of isolation for just 45 minutes!" Misty thought she was asking the impossible. Two minutes later an officer came and asked her if she wanted to go outside. She couldn't believe it! *Was God real*? On the way to seeing daylight for the first time in days, a distraction happened, and the officer rescinded the offer to go outside. She was heading back to her cell and isolation. Mad at God, her sceptic heart kicked in, only to have the officer change his mind again and lead her to a courtyard where she spent an hour outside on her face saying, "I believe God is alive and real and He loves me!"

In that moment, all her guilt and shame were replaced by God's amazing grace and love. She confessed her old ways and wanted to learn more about this God who loves like that. Misty was so hungry for understanding God's ways that she read everything she could get her hands on. She read the Scriptures by the hours, learning what God wanted for her.

Misty discovered Along Side Ministries, (ASM) inside the prison, attended a church service, and fell in love with ASM. She immediately knew she wanted to be part of this ministry. As a result of ASM, she began to understand God's Word better. She experienced worship with other believers for the first time. Transformation was taking place in her heart; her old ways of thinking and behaving were being melted away and replaced with a heart for Jesus. She became a leader on her yard and eventually a teacher for inmate-led Bible studies. Misty began to help new believers understand what she had learned about God. She was committed to doing whatever it took to be more like Jesus.

If you could meet Misty and spend five minutes with her, after those five minutes you would be so encouraged by her dynamic love for God you would be inspired by what God is


Along Side Ministries, Celebrates Graduate...Brenda Fry




Some bittersweet news...
